    - g. Satisfactorily complete at least 12 hours of training on Principles of Building Construction Series of instructional courses which are similar in content with the National Fire Academy courses; and,
    - h. Satisfactorily complete at least 24 hours of training on Fire Tactics Series of instructional courses which are similar in content with the National Fire A ademy courses.
