

- To identify unknown chemicals
- To help provide insight for you to assist in the resolution of your incident
- To provide safe monitoring, identification, and mitigation without putting your responders or the general public in danger
- Work with Fire, Police, EMS, DPW <u>Any Agency</u>







When and How to Call?



- If it's beyond your capabilities, CALL.
- Contact Monmouth County Radio Room, Ask for "<u>Hazmat Task Force</u>"
- Specify if you want to <u>consult</u> or if you want a <u>response</u>
- Must provide a contact name and phone number of the IC
- Location of Command Post
- DEP Case Number 1-877-WARN-DEP (877-927-6337)
 - (IC Must Get Case Number)

Old vs. Current Response Methodologies

Old

- 1. Level A on almost every call
- 2. Confusion over what product is involved, and how to handle
- 3. Entended scene times
- 4. Elaborate and Lengthy Decon and cleanup times

Current

- 1. Mission driven PPE selection based on "keep me alive 5"
- 2. Rapid entry so you start obtaining answers fast!

Above The Line / Jelew The Line Technician

3. Scene times are significantly reduced by rapid classifications

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
4. Decon is simplified

Response Capabilities

- Remote Advanced Air Monitoring
- **CBRNE** [Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear, Explosive] Detection and Response
- Unknown chemical identification and remediation
- Spill, Leak, Release containment or advisory
- Identify public safety factors such as evacuation radius, contamination radius and environmental factors
- Safely decontaminate personnel and equipment from chemicals and substances i.e. Carfentanyl & Fentanyl







Response Capabilities.....Continued



- Chlorine (A/B/C)
- Propane Flaring
- Cryogenics (CO2, Liquid Oxygen, Nitrogen, etc...)
- Mass Decontamination
- Technical Decontamination
- Unknown Chemical Identification
- (50) Hazardous Materials Technicians
- Hazardous Materials Specialists
